Backpacks (\$/D) Avg. cost \$25 – to carry books.

Education (\$) – to cover tuition fees for GED programs, and higher education degrees.

GED Testing (\$) Avg. cost \$115– fees for GED testing.

Work Boots & Protective Clothing (\$/D) – steel toe boots, gloves, coveralls, tool belts and other clothing required for certain employment.

Work Clothes (\$/D) - professional clothing and appropriate clothing for job interviews, etc.

CRISIS AND BASIC NEEDS

Dental Services (\$/R) – to cover emergency dental services for those without insurance, out-of-pocket expenses, and support the successful opening of a new year-round community dental clinic at Chemeketa Community College.

Eye Glasses (\$/R) Avg. cost \$105-125– to cover exams and prescriptions for glasses, typically identified as a need when people are taking educational placement exams or classes to gain employment skills.

Household Cleaning Supplies & Furnishings (\$/D) – Laundry detergent, dish soap, cleaning supplies, brooms, mops, dishes, utensils, pots/pans, bedding, furniture, etc. to equip people to live independently.

Housing (\$) – to cover rent deposits, application fees, and subsidize housing costs while individuals gain job skills and find employment.

Medical Services(\$/R) – to cover services for those without insurance and out-of-pocket expenses associated with health care.

Personal Hygiene Items (\$/D) – soap, deodorant, tooth brushes, toothpaste, razors, shaving cream, etc.

Prescriptions (\$) – to bridge the gap between leaving a facility and being enrolled in a prescription drug program or cover ongoing costs for those without insurance.

TRANSPORTATION

Bicycles and Helmets (\$/D) – to get to work, particularly on weekends, when busses do not run.

Bus Passes (\$) One month pass \$40 – to get to school, work, child visitations, health care appointments, etc.

Driver's Licenses (\$) Avg. reinstatement fee \$75 – to cover costs associated with getting an OR driver's license or I.D. card, required for employment or to secure public assistance.
