The Pine Street Resource Center

Approximately 50-60 people in prison are released each month into Marion County. About 3,800 people are on County “supervision.”

- More than 50% of those released from prison have no place to live
- Most have no employment
- Many need treatment for drug-related offenses
- Many others are on mental health medications

The Marion County Reentry Initiative exists to address community safety concerns by assisting ex-offenders to successfully transition from incarceration to the community. This effort between law enforcement agencies, local service organizations, churches and business leaders is reshaping how Salem and the rest of Marion County deals with the 600-700 men and women released from prison each year back into our community.

Once the cycle of criminal behavior is broken, the incidence of recidivism plummets. Millions of dollars of tax-payer dollars could be saved each year by reducing recidivism in this way. More importantly, a successful reentry reduces crime, restores lives and builds healthier communities.

A recent development in the Marion County Reentry Initiative is the opening of the Pine Street Resource Center. It is a one-stop center that will improve access to existing resources and provide direct services to ex-offenders. This includes access to legal, medical, educational and employment assistance. Additional services that will provide a foundation for success include housing, transportation, family reunification and others.

The center staff and representatives from other community agencies are available to assist with case management, problem solving and connecting to resources.

The Pine Street Resource Center Offers:

- Employment Assistance
- Education Assistance
- Assistance Obtaining an I.D.
- Housing Assistance and Referrals
- Child and Family Services Assistance
- Transportation Assistance
- Basic Needs (clothing, hygiene items, food, etc.)
- Legal Assistance
- Health and Mental Health Assistance
- Other Services (Veteran’s, Disability, DMV assistance, etc.)
